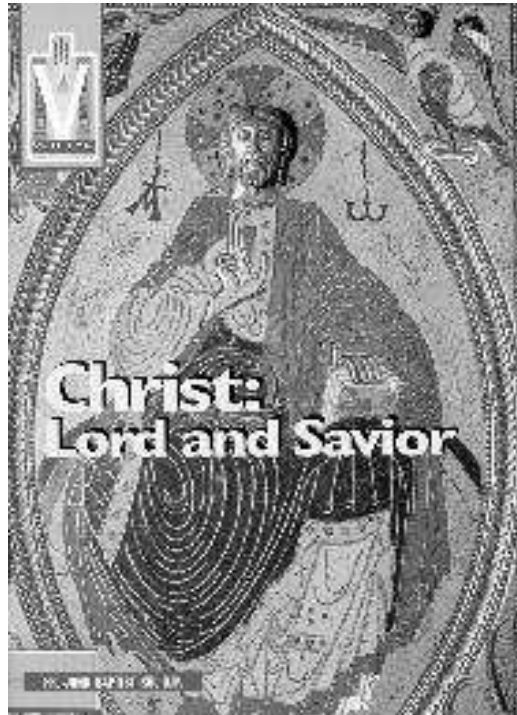
First Degree:

CIS Helps You Learn More about Christ



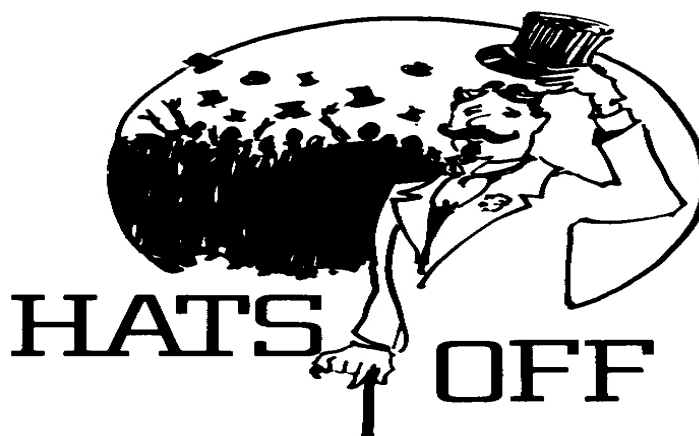
At Mass on Sunday we profess to “believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ.” How much do you know about Jesus? The Catholic Information Service booklet *Christ: Lord and Savior* (358) details the errors made about belief in Jesus Christ during the first 500 years of Christianity. Early Christians fell into the errors of Docetism (Jesus was not really human), Gnosticism (Jesus came to impart secret knowledge, not salvation from sins), Arianism (Jesus was not fully divine), Apollinarianism (Jesus did not have a human soul), Nestorianism (Jesus was two persons, divine and human), and Monophysitism (Jesus had only one nature). Each of these errors prompted the Church to further clarify the true Christian belief in Jesus Christ. Why did the Church need to address these errors? Groups of people, frequently led by an influential religious figure (e.g., Arius, Nestorius, etc.), started to believe and teach false things about Jesus Christ. But Jesus charged the Church with the duty of teaching all nations, a duty which includes the refutation of errors.

It is often said that there are no new errors. Rather, the same old errors are repackaged in different ways for contemporary consumption. Therefore, it is helpful to be familiar with the old errors so that we will recognize them when they are presented to us today. Are these errors around today? Definitely! *The Da Vinci Code* repackages ancient Arian and Gnostic heresies (among others) for entertainment. Jehovah’s Witnesses have beliefs about Jesus that are basically Arian. Some strands of the New Age movement are Nestorian in their teachings about Jesus.

Besides helping us avoid errors, a clear knowledge of what the Church teaches about Jesus Christ helps us come to know Him better, which is how we can be transformed in Him by the power of the Holy Spirit and be made holy. The final section of *Christ: Lord and Savior* discusses
